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There is a mistake in the first footnote. This should read:

Although this quotation eloquently shows precisely what is at stake in this paper, a point of clarification is in order. De Vattel got the facts wrong, possibly following the at his time well-known account of Garcilazo. In short, the Inca Atahualpa was not tried through a fair procedure as sometimes suggested but rather executed, in haste, on expediency grounds. Pizarro and some of his men feared an attempt to rescue him while waiting for reinforcements. Moreover, he was allegedly executed for offences against Pizarro and the Spaniards, not for offences against his own people. Incidentally, Pizarro's decision was heavily criticized in Spain on grounds that he lacked the right to try a King.
