Ingredients:

1 cosmological argument (contingency brands)

2 diamonds (any size)

1 teaspoon S5 extract

Serves: more than your cosmological argument

Preparation time: 5 min

Directions:

1. On a clean page, paste your favorite cosmological argument for a necessary being.
2. Chop off the conclusion. Reserve for later.
3. In a medium-sized conjunction, combine all the premises.
